It is hard to believe twelve months has passed since the great decision by Trinity not to pursue the development on the corner of Royal Parade and Morrah Street. Trinity have now signed a major lease to consolidate their Foundation Studies in a new campus on Elizabeth Street. They will be joined there on the old Melford Motors site by CSL who are locating their Global HQ there. The good news is the Parkville Bio Medical site is growing towards the city. These moves coupled with the Parkville Station and tram superstop at Grattan Street make the precinct more important than ever and we are glad it is heading South!

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Kay Thorne 30/11/1940 – 11/7/2019

Kay Thorne, one of the founding members of the Parkville Association, sadly passed away in July.

Kay made a major contribution to the preservation of South Parkville allowing it to remain one of the truly intact Victorian precincts in Australia. Kay led in the “Wade case” and was famous for sitting on the seat of a bulldozer to prevent the demolition of Deloraine Terrace!

Kay was instrumental in establishing the planning rules enabling the preservation of Victorian buildings and streetscapes that underpin the controls used today.

Kay lived in Parkville from 1958 when she completed her tertiary education in science and criminology. She was a very successful CEO of a number of national associations including the NCIS and National Roads Association. Her husband Tim Todhunter was also a former President of the Parkville Association.

As you walk around our glorious suburb and enjoy the intact Heritage streets and properties think of Kay, a true Parkville Warrior! Our thoughts to Tim and family.

Traffic

As mentioned some calming measures have taken place but as we are all aware “rat running” has increased dramatically since the closure of Grattan Street. The latest traffic survey has been completed and we will have the results in early November. Traffic flows are concerning but also speed where in the last survey vehicles were tracked in some cases at over 70 kph. The North Melbourne Police have been spoken to however it is difficult to monitor on small streets. As residents we can all do our own bit and if we drive within the speed limits it will have an overall calming affect

It beggars belief when the average speeds in Gatehouse, Park Drive and Degraives are over 40 kph given the overall 40 kph speed limit and the traffic jams that occur particularly on Gatehouse.

Many of our residents have young children and getting them in and out of cars with speeding traffic is unsafe. Let’s pull together on this!

Melbourne Metro

The Parkville Association participates bi monthly in the Metro Tunnel Community Reference Group. This enables our input in matters relating to Parkville Station or other traffic/building issues.

The major news this month is that the works are beginning to create the station entrances on Royal Parade. Sadly this means the removal of several elms which sit over the actual entrances. Royal Parade is Heritage protected however the trees actually sit over the new entrances. Semi mature trees will replace those removed.

Calming work on the corner of Park Drive was built in September to stop the speeding “rat runners” it has worked when those that observe the law slow down.

Works have been going for almost two years so only 5 more to go!! Our interests are to ensure Grattan Street is reopened as soon as possible and that traffic disruptions are minimised.

Rob Moore was part of a group that had a tour of the new station 30 metres under Grattan Street. “the size of the project is amazing and the work completed to date which takes the hole to just above the tunnel cannot be appreciated from street level”.

Parkville Post Office

A lot of misinformation has floated around Parkville re the above. The building is privately owned and the current tenant given notice from the end of December. We have had correspondence with the CEO of Australia Post and key management there. They are very supportive in ensuring Parkville retains a Post Office. We have also written to lawyers acting on behalf of the owners. They are corresponding and taking instructions from the owners who are UK based.

We are hoping that alternative premises can be found or a last minute change of heart from the owners. Rob Moore has spoken regularly to all parties and of course Heritage Victoria as the building has the highest level of protection. The PO has operated on the site since 1883 and the exterior is totally protected. We will work hard to ensure this continues.
